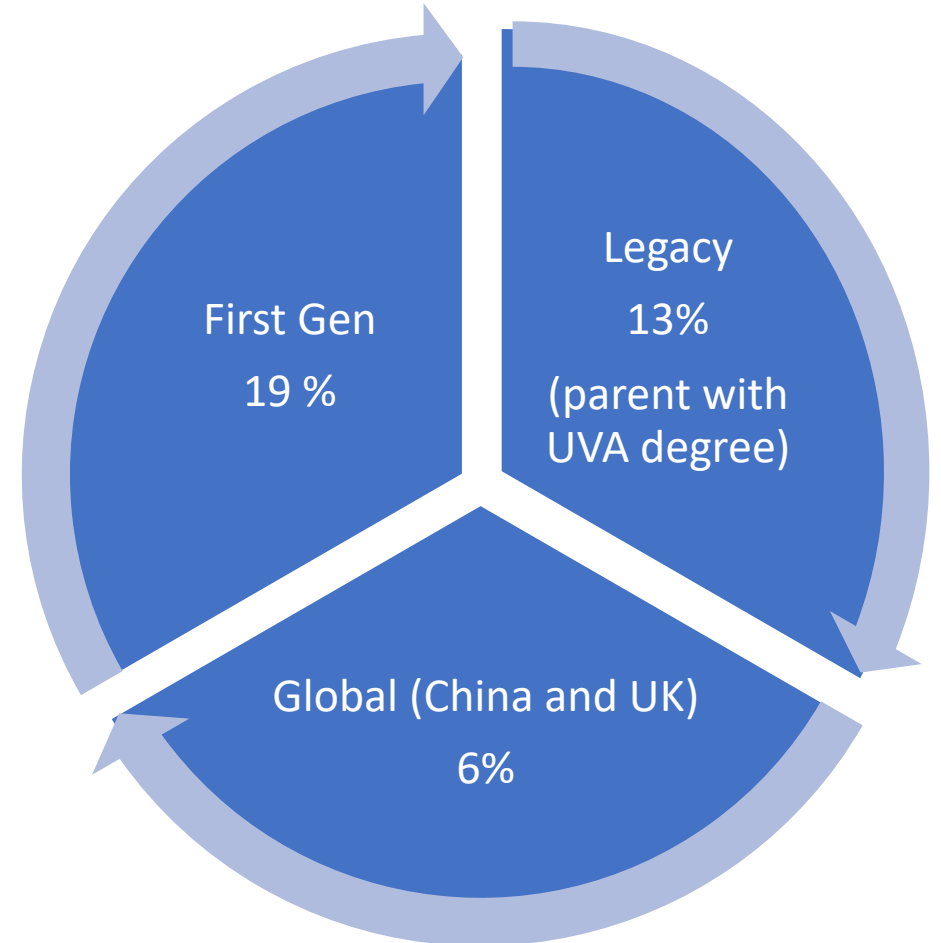

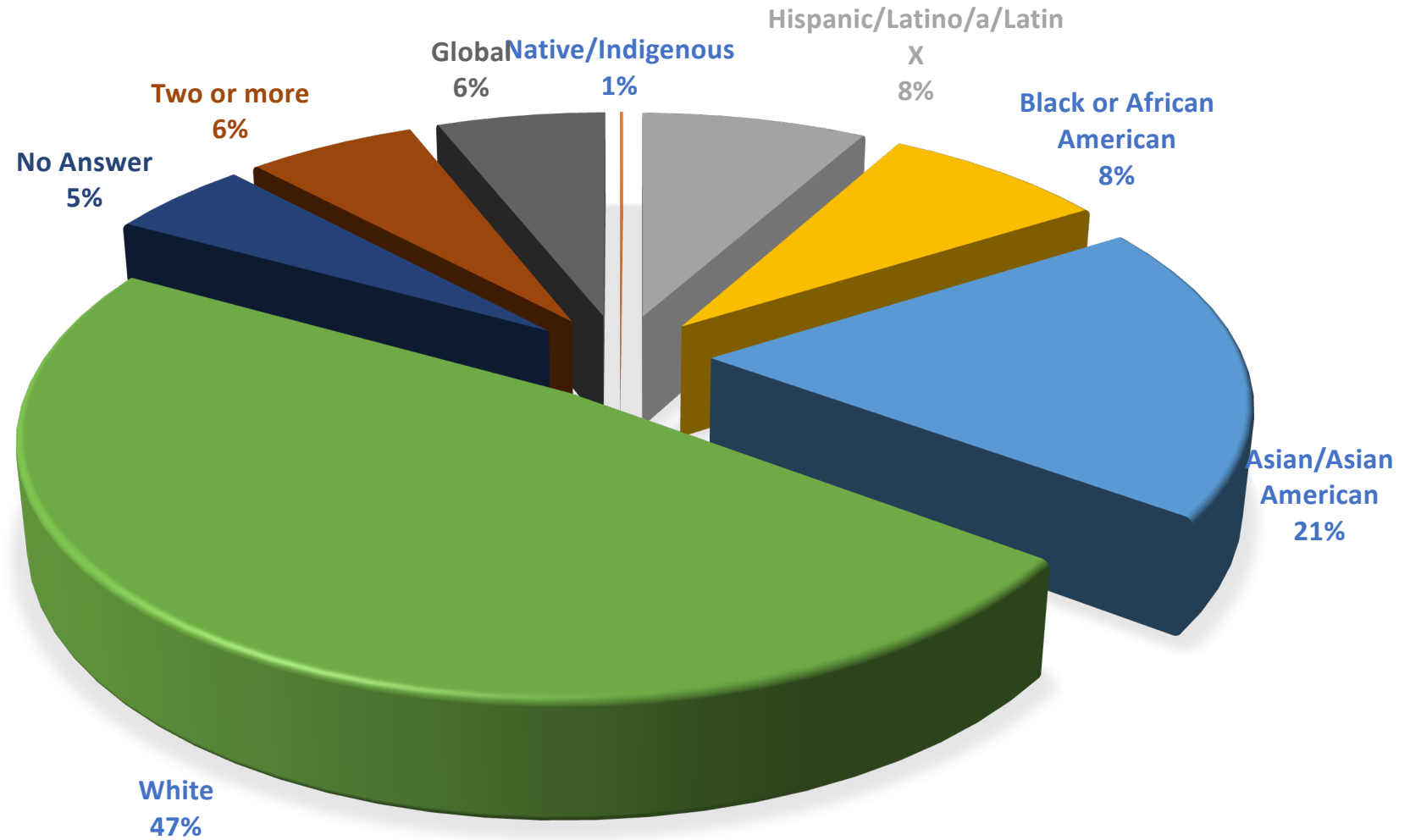
# WHO ARE WE ADVISING? Class of 2027



# COMMUNITY and ADVISING

**Advisors are instrumental in helping students feel like they do belong to our community**

**Advisors are people who can help students navigate the academic world**

- Act as a resource or conduit to other opportunities and offices



# Advising Meetings and Relationships: What do we encounter?

- **Transactional Mentality** (release hold, help me get into a class)
- **Translational Mentality** (how do I understand what are the requirements?)
- **Logistics** (Where do I go for help with academic support/tutoring/SIS)
- **BIG PICTURE-→**
  - Class /Major/ Career
  - College Expectations/Transition to College from HS
  - Pressure to Perform

# Meeting and Working with Advisees



Beginning of the semester (Fall and Spring) outreach

Introduce yourself and how they should contact you  
Add/Drop



Course Enrollment for Spring/Fall

Enrollment HOLD ---only the advisor can release  
Two-week period to meet with pre-major advisees  
Meet/Discuss class schedule prior to releasing hold

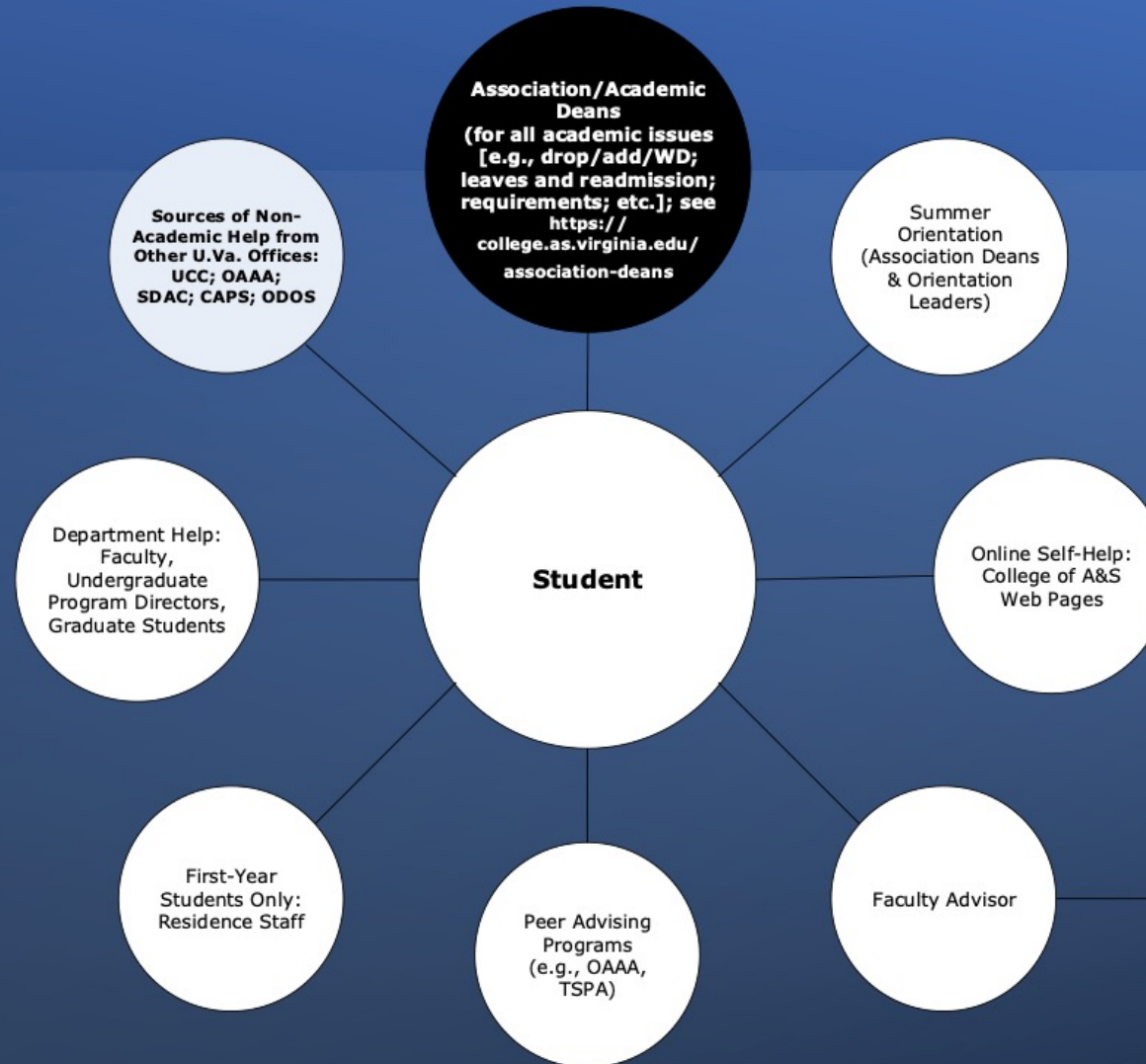

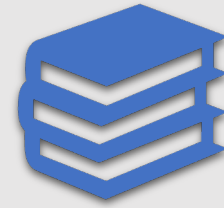
