



Introduce yourself and how they should contact you Add/Drop



Course Enrollment for Spring/Fall

Enrollment HOLD ---only the advisor can release

Two-week period to meet with pre-major advisees

Meet/Discuss class schedule prior to releasing hold




MAJORS (Application Only) and alternatives—deadlines in January and February




