These federal laws mandate that institutions of higher learning provide equal access to students with disabilities who are “otherwise qualified” to meet the essential demands of the academic program.</p> <p>The LNEC provides services to two groups of students: those who have been previously diagnosed with a disability condition; and those who have never been diagnosed, but begin struggling academically, and seek evaluation of their difficulties.
