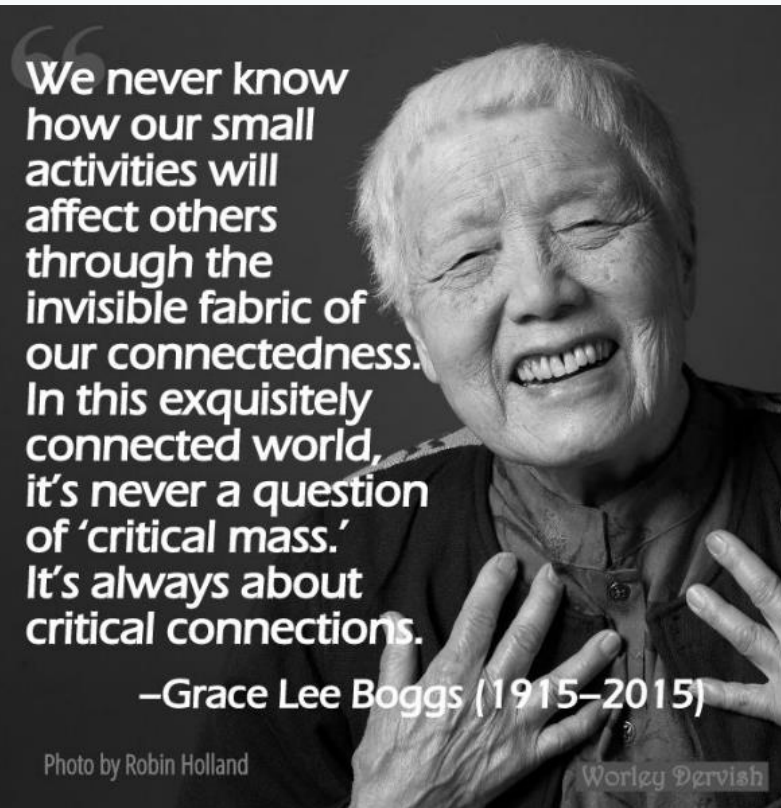

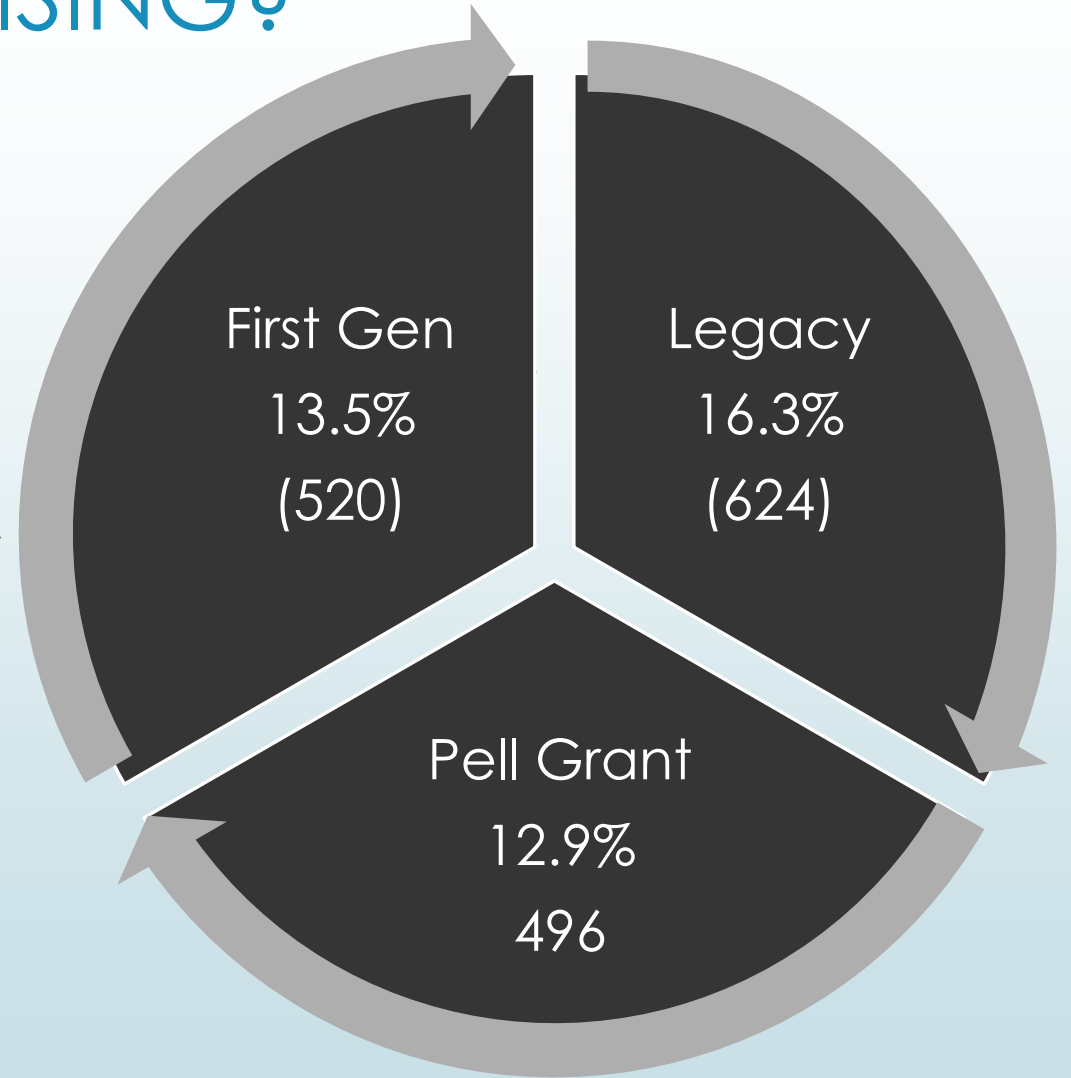

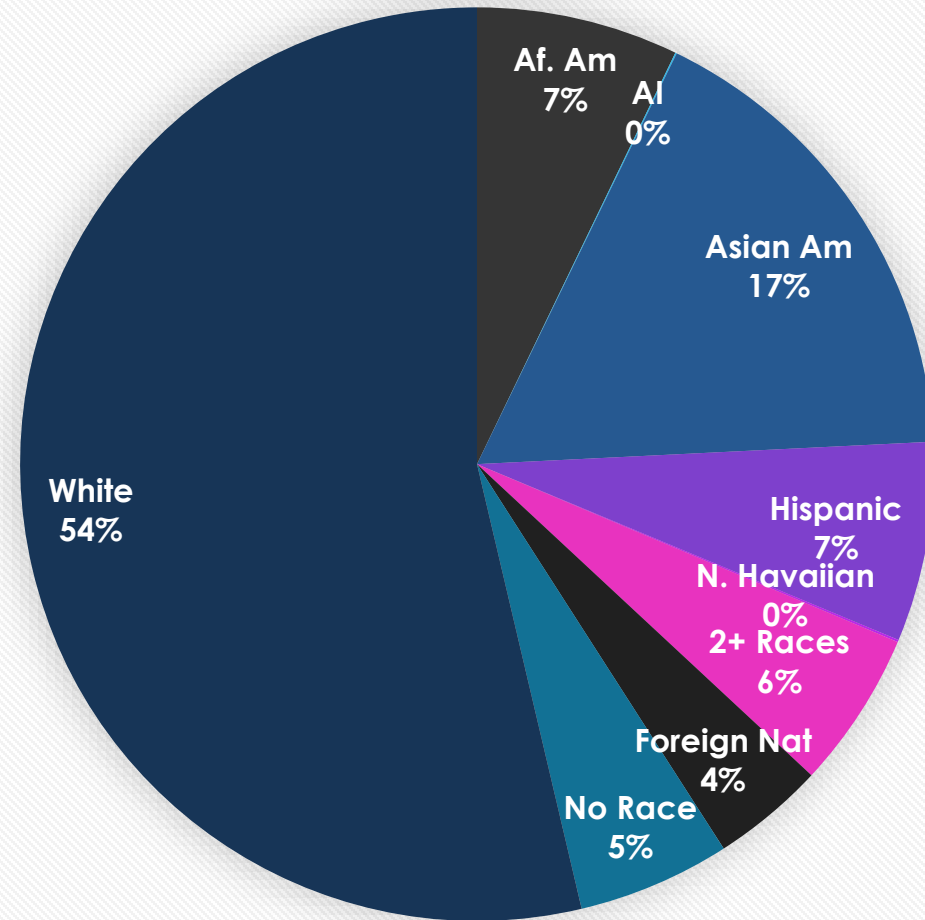

- ▶ COLLEGE 2020 Admissions
  - ▶ 2912 students/3832
  - ▶ Engineering, Architecture, Nursing, Kinesiology : 920 (685 are Engineering)
- ▶ 67% Virginian
- ▶ 33% Out of state/nation

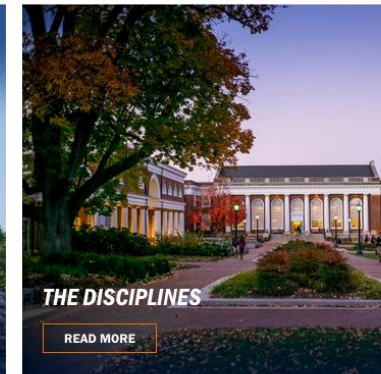
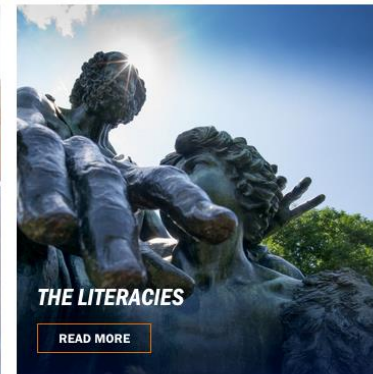
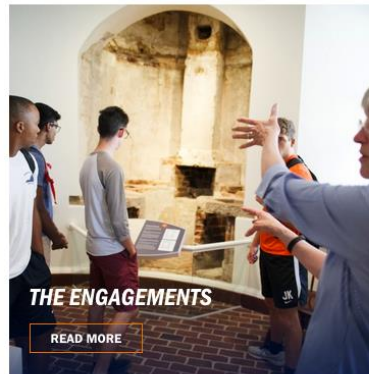

## ENGAGEMENTS PATHWAY

Students in the Engagements Pathway fulfill their general education requirements by taking courses across three components:



### ▼ Engagements (8 credits)

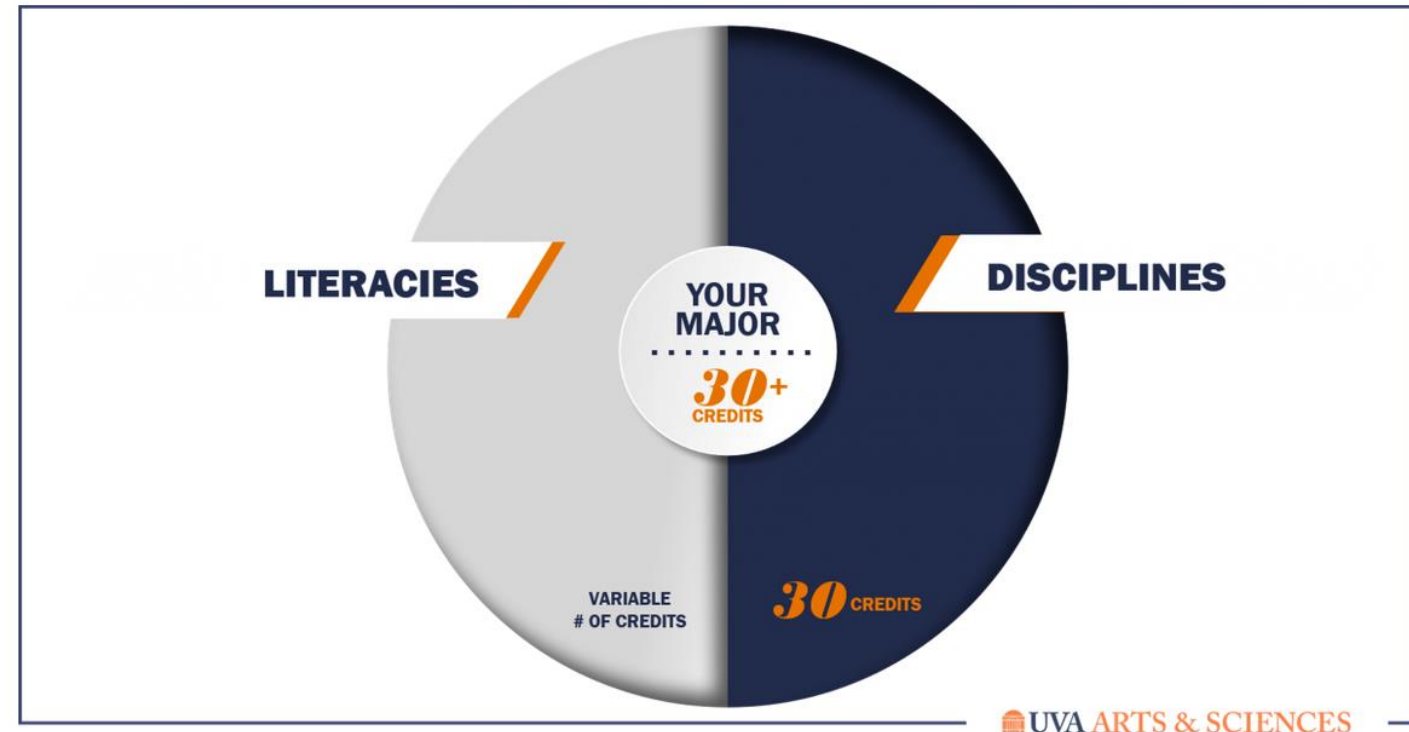
The *Engagements* are a series of courses offered exclusively for first-year students in the new College Curriculum. All first-year students in the College Curriculum must complete one 2-credit course in each of the four Engagements (totaling 8 credits):

- EGMT 1510 - Engaging Aesthetics
- EGMT 1520 - Empirical and Scientific Engagement
- EGMT 1530 - Engaging Differences
- EGMT 1540 - Ethical Engagement

Most Engagement courses meet for 7 weeks. Students are advised to enroll in only one of these courses at a given time – thus, a typical student would enroll in two consecutive 7-week Engagements in each semester.

# Disciplines PLUS

## DISCIPLINES PLUS PATHWAY



Students in the Disciplines Plus Pathway fulfill their general education requirements by taking courses across twocomponents:

- › Literacies (variable credits)
- › Disciplines Plus (30 credits)



# Engagements Pathway and Disciplines Plus

## Literacies

- ▶ Rhetoric for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century (6 credits)
  - ▶ First Writing Req
  - ▶ Second Writing Req
- ▶ World Languages
- ▶ Quantification, Computation and Data Analysis

## Disciplines (21 vs 30)

- ▶ Artistic, Interpretative, & Philosophical Understanding
- ▶ Chemical, Mathematical, and Physical Universe
- ▶ Cultures and Societies of the World
- ▶ Historical Perspectives
- ▶ Living Systems
- ▶ Science and Society
- ▶ Social and Economic Systems



# Advising for Forum Students, Echols, and 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Year Transfer Students

## ► Forum Students (120)

- Enrolled in Forums (themed classes) for 2 year curriculum.
- 40 students in each Forum (3)
- First Writing Req
- Second Writing Req
- World Language Requirement
- Forum 1500
- Forum 2500 Capstone
- Other classes dependent on topic

## ► Echols

- 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Year Transfer Students (traditional curriculum)

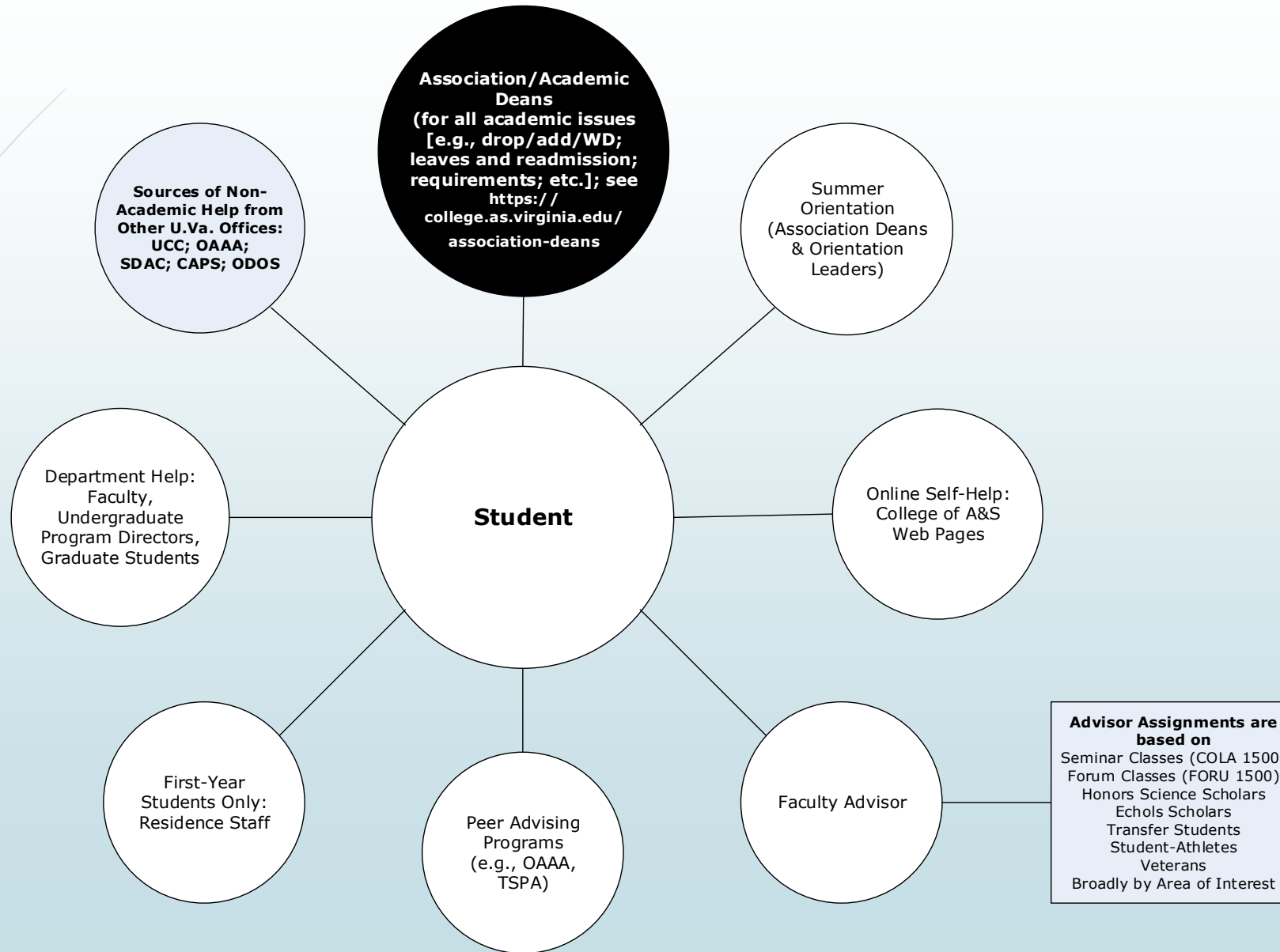

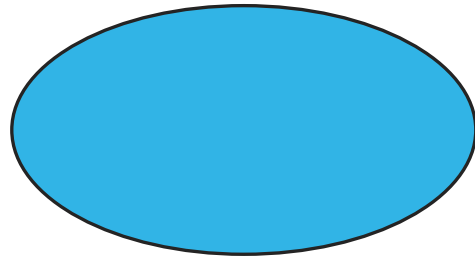
The advising period with your Faculty Advisor, Association Dean, and other Advisors allows time for discussion and reflection.
